

What does Tory Health Policy mean for the NHS and you?

Tuesday 9th March 2010, Institute of Directors, Pall Mall, London

The purpose of the one day national workshop is to set out the Conservative health policy in a non-political environment and examine the likely impact on service provision and design. The impact on patients and for the management of the service.

Key indicators such as targets are to be replaced with outer outcome measures. What is the impact of these changes?

Funding continues to be a concern. Tory policy is to protect funding but up-lifts in line with inflation are the same as cash cuts in a service that is growing from demand, new access requirements, the elderly and technology.

Preparing to manage the NHS in a new environment, what managers should be thinking about and how services might take on a new look are the objectives of the day.

The possibility of substantial changes in the evaluation of pharmaceutical products, the use of greater telehealth/telecare are all policy objectives that will require thought and planning.

The workshop will be opened by a putative Tory Health Minister, Mark Simmonds.

Delegates should leave with a clear understanding of what they should be doing in advance of a general election and the most likely outcome, a Conservative administration.
